

- 1.** You require frequent repetition
- 2.** People seem to mumble or sound muffled
- 3.** You hear but have trouble understanding
- 4.** Background noise makes it hard to hear
- 5.** Phone conversations are difficult
- 6.** You turn up the TV volume too loud
- 7.** Difficulty following conversations of two or more people
- 8.** Don't hear doorbell or phone ringing
- 9.** Have ringing in your ears
- 10.** Answer or respond inappropriately to conversations

Your Journey to Better Hearing

Only a qualified hearing professional can tell you whether there is hearing loss and recommend the best course of action.

What to expect. During your visit, a hearing assessment* and listening experience with hearing devices, if appropriate, will be conducted. You will be informed of the results.

Your hearing care professional will discuss your hearing history and get information about your hearing needs.

Bring someone with you. If possible, bring a friend or loved one to your visit. It helps to have a recognizable voice for the "familiar voice" part of the exam and results in a more accurate test. Plus, you'll get more out of your visit if someone close to you can share in the experience.

Next steps. You will be advised about the nature of your hearing loss and your hearing care professional will make recommendations. Hearing instruments help most people. You can try a hearing device right in the office and take advantage of a risk-free, at-home trial. Wearing hearing aids and treating your hearing loss can improve your quality of life and stave off potential hearing loss-related health risks.
